— Inside the <u>Smart Sensing for Humans (SMASH) Lab</u>, researchers use data collected from one type of sensor to train another. Their work, called <u>IMU2Doppler</u>, has shown that data collected from inertial measurement unit (IMU) <u>sensors in smartwatches can quickly train a millimeter wave doppler</u> to recognize human movements and behaviors.
