## TODAY AT 5 P.M.

— CMU's <u>Humanist League</u> presents Sagan Fest 2022 today at 5pm in McConomy Auditorium. Famed evolutionary biologist David Sloan Wilson will give a lecture – Evolving a World that Works for All: Fulfilling the Spirit of Humanism in the Internet Age – focused on applying principles to create a more cooperative and collaborative world.

- New research from the Robotics Institute (RI) can <u>help robots feel layers of cloth</u>, which could one day allow robots to assist people with household tasks such as folding laundry.
- Alumni Profile: Kiran Bhat, who earned his Ph.D. in 2004, has spent his career <u>using computer vision technologies to make</u> <u>animated characters look more lifelike</u>, first at Industrial Light and Magic and then through his own startup, Loom.ai.
- ICYMI: CMU recently gathered to <u>celebrate five decades of research</u> that enables people to talk to computers and more importantly computers to understand their speech. The event culminated with the two-hour <u>Raj Reddy Al Lecture on the impact of speech research at CMU</u>.
- Research into generative models that can create images like sinister cats is just one example of some rather <u>spooky</u> <u>research</u> that's been happening in SCS.
- Recent research from RI's Robots Perceiving and Doing (RPAD) lab used a planning algorithm called <u>trajectory optimization to investigate how a robot should adjust its movements</u> as it worked toward flattening dough into a circle.
