Returning after a brief hiatus due to the pandemic, the workshop encourages women in computer science to consider graduate school and research after they earn an undergraduate degree.
- CMU and <u>Simcoach Games</u> have teamed up to <u>give high school students interested in game design on-the-job training</u> and a first step toward a career in game design, development and production.
